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# Texas Child Mental Health Care Consortium (TCMHCC)

*Improving mental health care and systems of care for the children and adolescents of Texas.*

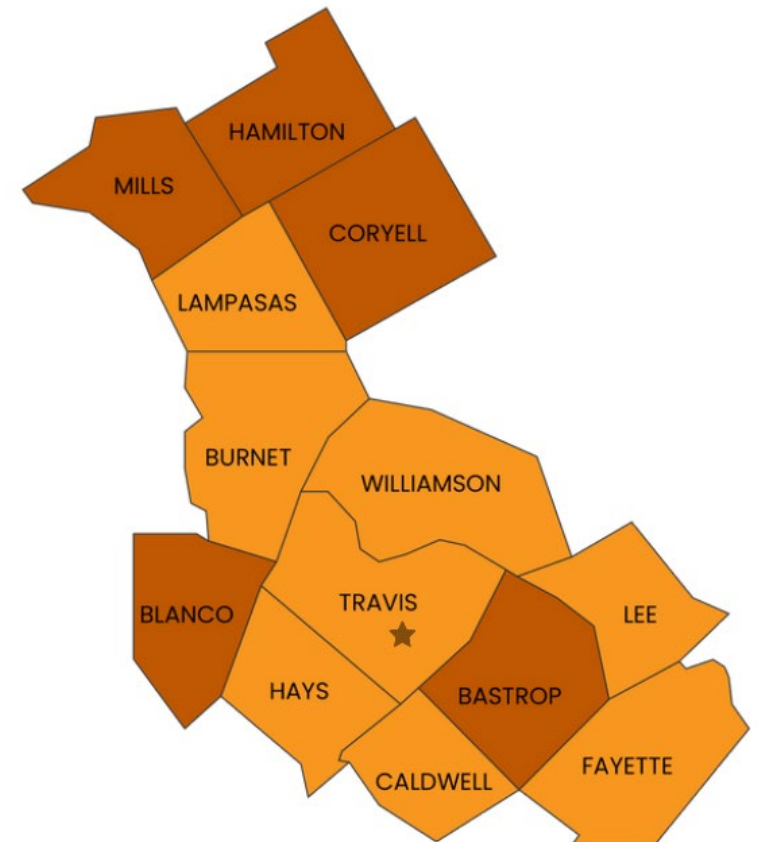
- The Texas Child Mental Health Care Consortium (TCMHCC) was created by the 86th Texas Legislature to leverage the expertise and capacity of the health-related institutions of higher education to address urgent mental health challenges and improve the mental health care system in this state in relation to children and adolescents.
- In 2021, the Texas Legislature approved federal funding from the American Rescue Plan Act for expanded services of several of the Consortium's initiatives.

The Texas Child Mental Health Care Consortium (TCMHCC) programs are available statewide.

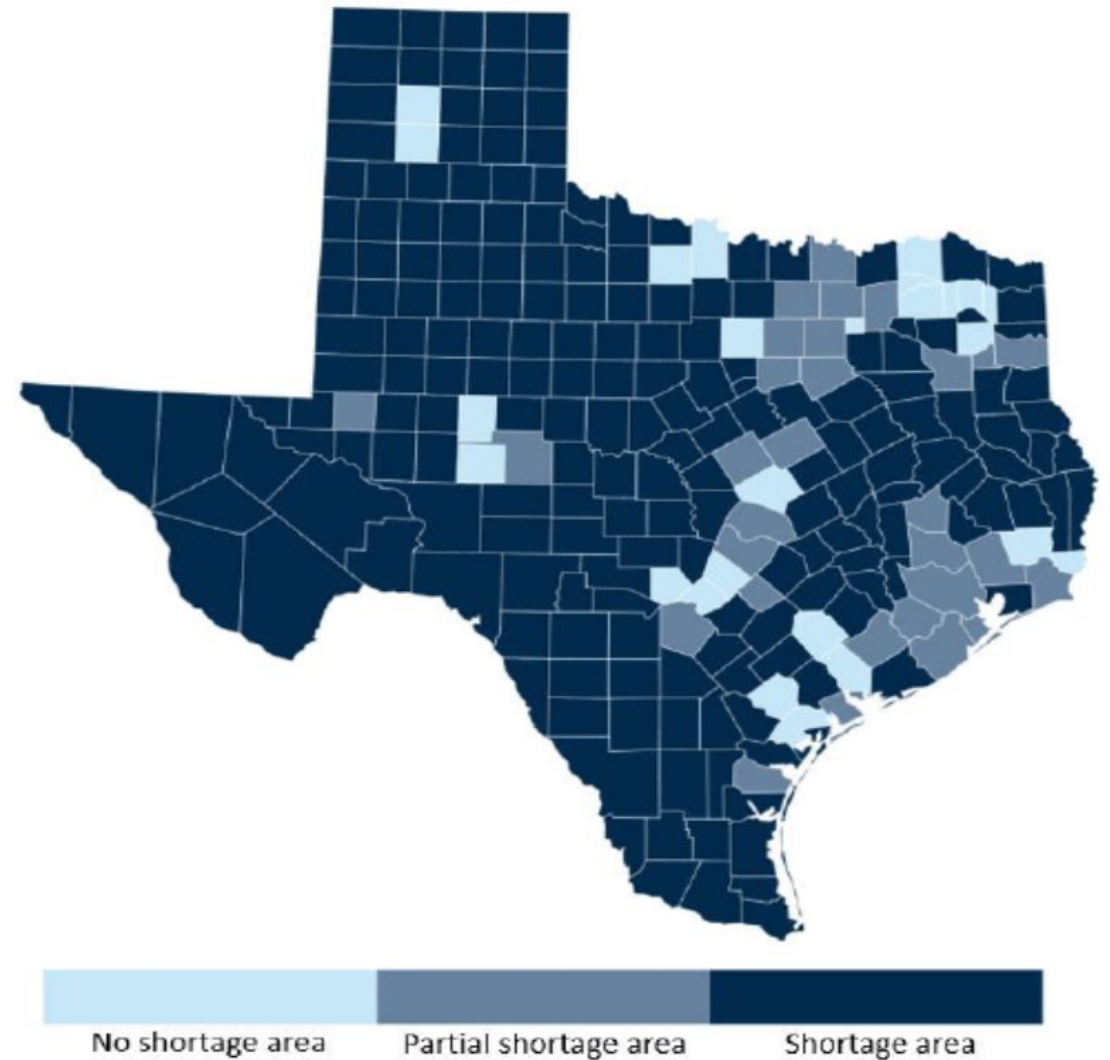
DMS provides TCMHCC services for 13 Central Texas counties:

# Lack of Access

- More than 80% of Texas counties are federally designated as Mental Health Professional Shortage Areas
- Of the 254 counties in Texas, 185 have no psychiatrist directly affecting 3.2 million people (Merritt Hawkins data)

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# Texas Child Health Access Through Telemedicine (TCHATT)

TCHATT provides telemedicine or telehealth programs to school districts to help identify and assess the behavioral health needs of children and adolescents and provide access to mental health services.





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# TCHATT Services



## Assessment, Brief Intervention, and Stabilization

- No-cost short-term telehealth services as clinically necessary



## Care Coordination

- Referrals to community programs & providers



## School Consultations

- Direct consultation with clinicians to discuss mental health needs of students in school environment



## Education

- Mental health training and resources for school personnel and community providers

# TCHATT-ASUD



Adolescent Substance Use Disorder (TCHATT-ASUD) provides services to youth who need help with risky or unhealthy use of substances.

**TCHATT-ASUD providers collaborate with adolescents and their families to:**

- Assess for risk and safety
- Develop a recovery plan to reduce harm caused by substance use
- Complete assessments to track progress towards goals
- Provide long-term treatment providers and resources in the community, as needed

# TCHATT-Trauma



Trauma Focused Expansion (TCHATT-Trauma) services provide evidence-based treatment for children who have experienced significant trauma.

## **TCHATT-Trauma providers collaborate with youth and their families to:**

- Assess student to determine appropriate type of care
- Provide 12-16 sessions of TF-CBT or TGCT
- Provide long-term treatment providers and resources in the community, as needed



# How is TCHATT Filling in the Gaps?

- Access to early mental health assessment and intervention in schools setting
- Bypass barriers that limit access to critical health services (e.g. transportation, time, costs)
- Integrated and multidisciplinary services
- Care coordination services to help families navigate medical and community systems
- Rapid access to mental health consultation for school staff

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# Youth Aware of Mental Health (YAM)

- Evidence-based program for 8-12th graders promoting increased discussion and knowledge about mental health, suicide prevention, and the development of problem-solving skills and emotional intelligence.
- YAM Logistics
  - Administered in-person
  - 5 total sessions, 45 minutes each
  - Delivered over 3-5 weeks
  - 7-30 students per class

- 01 What is mental health?
- 02 Self-help advice
- 03 Stress and crisis
- 04 Depression and suicidal thoughts
- 05 Helping a friend in need
- 06 Who can I ask for help?

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# Child and Perinatal Psychiatry Access Networks (CPAN/PeriPAN)

Child and Perinatal Psychiatry Access Networks (CPAN/PeriPAN) provide behavioral health consultation to primary care and reproductive care providers.



# Child and Perinatal Psychiatry Access Networks (CPAN/PeriPAN)

Funded by the Texas Legislature,  
CPAN/PeriPAN provides:



CPAN/PeriPAN are phone-based clinical consultation services that connect clinicians working with children, adolescents and perinatal women with a child or reproductive psychiatrist or mental health clinician



CPAN/PeriPAN offer assistance with referrals to community mental health services and can provide a one-time direct consult with the patient to assist with diagnostic clarification



CPAN/PeriPAN provide continuing professional education opportunities on pediatric and reproductive mental health



# How does CPAN/PeriPAN Work?

Clinicians can call and enroll within 5 minutes. Clinic administrators can enroll multiple clinicians.

It's simple to enroll, easy to use, and completely free. Call [888-901-CPAN \(2726\)](tel:888-901-CPAN(2726)) to enroll and get help with a patient quickly. No call is too small.

- Call or text and reach a licensed mental health clinician within 5 minutes
- A child or reproductive psychiatrist will call back within 30 minutes or at a time of the clinician's choosing
- CPAN and PeriPAN send vetted, local, and individualized referrals within 1 business day
- Teams are available Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and follow up after-hours messages the next business day
- Pediatric primary and reproductive health clinicians can call as often as they need



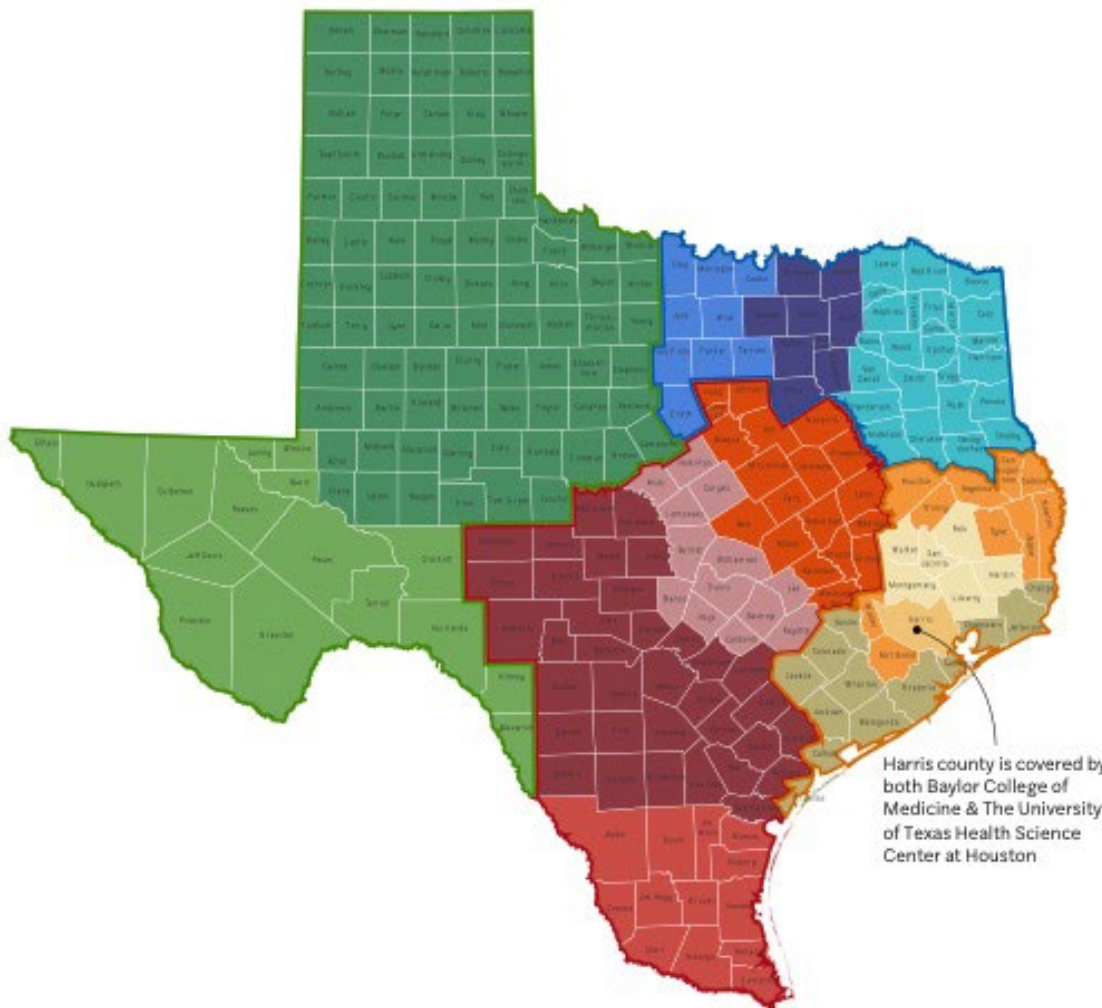

# CPAN/PeriPAN Direct

At the discretion of the CPAN/ PeriPAN mental health clinician, a free one-time psychiatric assessment with the child and guardian may be offered to a pediatric physician to enhance patient care.

## Face-to-Face Patient-Psychiatrist Consultations



### How it works:

Call CPAN at **888-901-CPAN (2726)** and dial 3, then 1, then 1 for a clinician-to-clinician consultation about your patient.



### If...

during your call, the child psychiatrist indicates a 1:1 consultation with the child and the CPAN team may be of benefit,



### Then...

they will discuss their reasoning for the 1:1 consultation and the next steps needed to prepare for the appointment.

### Requirements:

- 1 The child is not experiencing a mental health emergency (threatening harm to self or others).
- 2 The child's parent or guardian gives written consent and agrees to be present during the 1:1 consultation.
- 3 The Pediatric Health Clinician remains the primary health provider.

# How is CPAN/ PeriPAN Filling in the Gaps?

CPAN/PeriPAN is working to meet children, women and their clinicians where they are in various stages of childhood and pregnancy.

- Access to early psychiatric assessment and intervention in the patient's routine medical care.
- Support providers of pediatric and maternal health care to identify and manage their patients' mental health
- Promotes health equity
- Services are provided at no cost to clinicians and patients
- Expand access to education about pediatric & maternal mental health

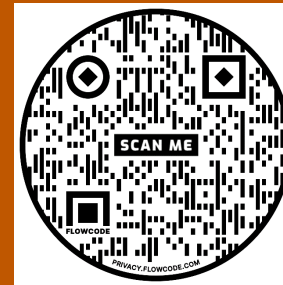

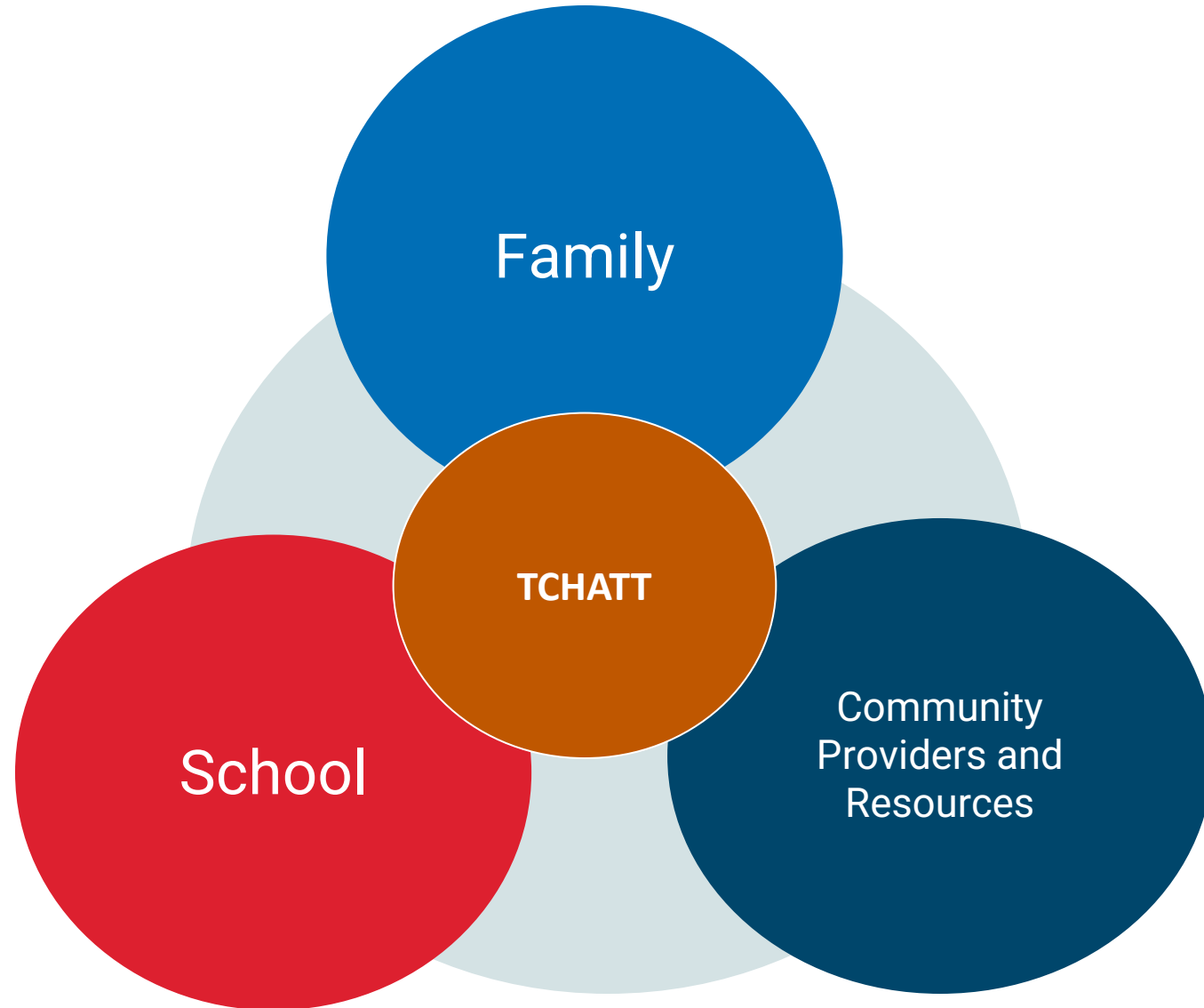
